

Triangle Scarf Pattern

Here's a quick, easy little knitted shawlette for summer. It's triangular and has long tails to tie in front or drape however you like. Using two yarns of different colors and textures makes it fun and interesting. See what combos you can come up with! We have lots of colorful and fun summer yarns to get you started. Or you could do the whole thing in a lovely mohair or lace wt. The possibilities are endless!

Triangle Scarf Pattern

Materials: 100 yards each of two yarns: A= solid color, B= multicolored
Size 8-9 knitting needles

Gauge: About 4 st/inch

Increases: Beginning of row: Knit one stitch, Yarn Over,
continue to knit the rest of the row.

End of row: Knit to last stitch, YO, knit 1.

Set aside about 5 yards of A for tassels if desired

Pattern: Using yarn A, cast on 3 st. Knit one row. Attach B. Knit 2 rows, increasing 1 st at beginning of each row. Change to A. Continue to knit each row, increasing at the beginning of each, and alternating 2 rows of A and B, until there are 49 or 50 st. on the needle. Continue in pattern, but increase at BOTH ends of each row until about 4 yards of A remain. Bind off loosely in A. Make 3 tassels to sew to points if desired. Wear with Flair!
